CPD — £1,890.97

Impact on staff confidence, subject knowledge and quality of PE provision

Continued investment in PE CPD has strengthened staff confidence and subject knowledge, supporting the delivery of high-quality PE across the school. Staff have developed greater confidence in teaching a range of sports and activities, including how to develop key skills, use equipment effectively and adapt provision to meet different needs and abilities.

Targeted professional development has supported staff in developing their practice and understanding of effective PE teaching. This has contributed to greater consistency in provision, with lessons providing purposeful opportunities for pupils to practise, develop and apply their skills. Continued investment in CPD will further strengthen staff expertise and support consistently high-quality PE provision across the school.

Equipment & resources — £13,288.78

Impact on access, participation, quality and breadth of PE/sport

Investment in PE and sport has improved access to a wider range of high-quality equipment, enabling pupils to participate more fully and spend greater time actively developing their skills. Increased availability of resources has also encouraged pupils to be more physically active during breaktimes and lunchtimes.

A broader range of sports and activities has increased participation and provided opportunities for pupils of different abilities, interests and levels of experience to participate and experience success. Investment in sport-specific resources has also supported preparation for inter-school tournaments and leagues, such as football, allowing pupils to develop the skills and confidence required to represent the school. In turn, these resources will support a wider range of future extra-curricular clubs and activities, strengthening the quality, variety and accessibility of PE and sport across the school.

Competitions & extra-curricular — £1,759.50

Impact on participation, engagement and opportunities beyond lessons

Participation in sport beyond lessons has increased, with both boys and girls accessing a wider range of competitions, festivals and sporting experiences. Opportunities have been provided for pupils of different abilities, ensuring that participation is inclusive and not limited to the most confident or experienced pupils.

Links with local clubs have introduced pupils to less familiar sports and experiences that may not otherwise have been available, increasing engagement and broadening sporting interests. Successful participation in competitions has also raised the profile of sport across the school, with pupils increasingly enthusiastic about representing the school and inspired by the achievements of their peers. These opportunities have supported wider personal development, including confidence, teamwork, resilience and a positive attitude towards physical activity.

Sustainability

How improvements will continue after the 2025-26 funding year

As a result of the investment made during 2025-26, the school is well positioned to sustain and build upon improvements in PE, physical activity and school sport. Investment in high-quality resources will provide a lasting benefit, ensuring pupils continue to access a broad range of activities during PE lessons, extra-curricular clubs and active breaktimes.

Beyond 2025-26, the school is committed to maintaining a strong and inclusive PE and sport offer. We will continue to prioritise extra-curricular and competitive opportunities, alongside ongoing staff CPD to strengthen expertise and ensure consistently high-quality PE provision. This long-term approach will embed physical activity within school life and continue to promote positive attitudes towards sport, health and wellbeing.
